Dear guests,

The sun is just rising above the horizon, casting a golden light over the landscape. It's Monday morning, 5:45 a.m. The alarm clock rings, and the streets are still almost deserted. Winemaker Paul has already had his first cup of coffee and is slipping into his shoes. There's a lot to do because, in recent weeks, the inconspicuous green berries have developed into nearly ripe grapes. Now, in the final days before the harvest, we have the chance to watch him as he prepares.

In the vineyard, the primary task is to determine the optimal harvest time for each plot. This requires regularly measuring the ripeness of the grapes. The most important factor in assessing ripeness is the sugar content, usually measured with a technical device called a refractometer. When it comes to evaluating aroma ripeness and tannin quality, Paul relies on his built-in measuring instrument: his taste.

To ensure he doesn't miss the perfect moment when sugar, acidity, tannins, and aroma are in balance, Paul must constantly keep an eye on the vineyard while also watching the sky. Rainy or particularly hot weather can affect the health of the grapes and ruin months of work. Over the decades, Paul has learned how his plots develop during ripening and when it's time to harvest. His father and grandfather also passed on their knowledge to him. While some of their old sayings might make him smile, there is a lot of practical advice in this heritage.

When it's time for the harvest, everything in the cellar must be ready as well. Paul knows that winemaking can only lead to the desired result if everything is kept clean. However, he prefers to leave the cleaning to his interns. Instead, Paul focuses on ensuring that all necessary materials, such as yeasts, barrels, and other tools, are ordered and that there is enough space in the winery to process the incoming grapes.

The fruits of Paul's hard work, and that of winemakers around the world, can be found on this menu. We wish you much enjoyment as you read and, above all, as you savor the wines.

Sparkling and Effervescent Wines

Sparkling and effervescent wines owe their uniqueness to the carbon dioxide that gives them liveliness and freshness. This molecule, which we also produce when we breathe, lifts the mood and makes everyday life a bit lighter. Excellent sparkling and effervescent wines are found worldwide, and we present here a selection from Germany, France, and Italy. A significant difference between sparkling and effervescent wines lies in the pressure within the bottle. Effervescent wines have a pressure of less than 2.5 bar, while sparkling wines have a pressure of over 3 bar. This is higher than the pressure in a car tire, so be careful when the cork pops!

Orange wines are currently one of the most exciting wine styles worldwide. These wines are produced by allowing white grape skins to remain in contact with the juice for an extended period. This process often gives the wine a more or less intense orange color. More importantly, it transforms the aromas and flavors of the wine. Hospices de Beaune

The bells ring. Excited voices fill every corner. Wine merchants, journalists, and wine enthusiasts sit closely packed in the "Halles de Beaune," eagerly awaiting the auction of hundreds of wine barrels. Prior to this moment, there was earnest tasting and discussion about the vintage quality and the evaluation of different wines. We too felt the tension in the room, as our team from Brenners Park-Hotel did not want to return from Burgundy empty-handed. Therefore, we carefully studied the auction catalog and prepared our bidding paddle.

In the heart of Burgundy, an auction has been taking place for over 160 years that is unparalleled. The Hospices de Beaune produces more than 50 wines from its best vineyard sites across 61 hectares. The unique aspect: Hospices de Beaune is not actually a winery but a former hospital. It possesses an impressive diversity of vineyards. The proceeds from the annual auction are donated to charitable causes.

The story of Hôtel-Dieu began in 1443. The Hundred Years' War had ended, and the population suffered from the hardships of recent decades. Nicolas Rolin, the Chancellor of Burgundy, founded a hospice to aid the poorest and most needy. The magnificent Gothic building with colorful roof tiles was no ordinary hospice. The wealthy chancellor spared no effort to create a palace for the poor and needy. The bourgeoisie donated artworks and lands, and winemakers contributed parcels of vineyards. In 1795, the first auction was held to sell the esteemed wine barrels.

Returning to the 161st auction, where the Brenners Park-Hotel team had the privilege of attending. The atmosphere was lively, and the highlight was undoubtedly the auction of "the Pièce des Présidents", which fetched a proud 800,000 euros for charity. We too were successful, and today we can present to you for the first time the 2021 Monthélie Les Duresses Cuvée Lebelin. This wine is named after Etienne Lebelin, the first hospital chaplain of Hospice de la Charité. It comes from a cooler site and, according to Burgundy expert Jasper Morris MW, has produced an aromatic wine with a fine and elegant finish in 2021.

Domaine de la Romanée-Conti —

The wine industry in Australia primarily focuses on the southern regions where the climate is moderate. Between the 30th and 40th southern parallels, mild summer temperatures of around 20°C prevail, although there are often low precipitation levels, necessitating artificial irrigation in many vineyards. Australian wine law mandates that over 85% of the wine must originate from the specified region indicated on the label. This law, enforced by the Wine and Brandy Corporation since 1987, ensures compliance through regular monitoring.
