

Dear Readers,

the sun is shining! The first birds sing in a canon from tree to tree. On the ground you can see crocuses and daffodils sprouting out of the ground. It's spring and the world seems to be waking up. Plants that have shaped mankind for thousands of years also grow in front of the gates of Baden-Baden; the vines. Around 26 billion liters of grapes ripen every year - a quantity that is enough to put more than 4 bottles of wine in the hands of every person on earth. This wave of wine slowly builds up over the summer and swells in the fall. All of this begins now, during the time of the budding.

In the next few weeks, the "eyes" of the vines will play a decisive role. It is the buds that remain dormant throughout the winter. In the frosty season, the vine draws its nutrients back into the creaky trunk and the eyes dry out. If the temperature stays above 8°C for a few days, the vine will begin to direct nutrients back into the shoots. When the winemaker says that the buds bleed, he means the phenomenon when the buds swell and the sap flows from the eyes. These small buds later grow into shoots that will bear flowers, leaves and grapes. A small masterpiece of the vine. The budding is therefore the first step on the way to the new wine.

In the new edition of our shortlist, you can marvel at the old and new wines from the Brenners Park Hotel wine cellar with your own eyes. I currently particularly enjoy drinking the following wines. The **2020 Griesel Riesling Tradition Brut** is an excellent example of how good German sparkling wine can be with its subtle yet complex aromas. The fact that we are also good at Chardonnay is shown by the **2018 Saalwächter Chardonnay R from Rheinhessen**, which would pass as an excellent Chardonnay from Burgundy in any blind tasting but is significantly more affordable than the wines from the Côte d'Or.

With the **2018 Guigal Côte-Rôtie Brune et Blonde** from the Rhône, you can lock me up in the Brenners on cooler spring evenings and enjoy the wine accompanied by a grilled piece of meat. I do not need more.

Enjoy reading and above all enjoy the wines.

Louis Roederer

Louis Roederer is one of the best houses in Champagne. The company was originally founded under the name Dubois Père & Fils. When Louis Roederer took over his uncle's inheritance in 1832, he promptly renamed it and focused on growth and quality. Because of this strategy, Louis Roederer is still one of the largest owners of vineyards in Champagne today, producing some of the region's most sought-after wines.

Bollinger

The history of Bollinger began in 1829 with Athanase de Villermont. He joined forces with the German emigrant Joseph Bollinger and the wine-loving Paul Renaudin and they founded the champagne house Renaudin-Bollinger & Cie, which became Bollinger over the decades. The family-run house does not stand still, but is constantly working on new projects, from sustainable viticulture to perfecting the development of the base wines in barriques.

Rosé Champagne

Did you know that two of the three grape varieties used for champagne are red? For most champagnes, the red varieties Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier are vinified white resulting in a light coloured champagne. And it is not only the colour that differentiates rosé champagne. The wines have a strawberry and raspberry scent and are richer and more abundant.

Sparkling and Semi-sparkling Wine

Carbon dioxide makes sparkling wines what they are. Simply a by-product of breathing to some, these molecules breathe new life into wines, exhilarate us and make life that much more fun. Nowadays, excellent sparkling and semi-sparkling wines can be found all over the world. Here, we have put together a collection from Germany, France and Italy. The difference between sparkling and semi-sparkling wines is mainly due to the pressure in the bottle. Semi-sparkling wines have less than 2.5 bar of pressure while sparkling wines must have over 3 bar. That's more pressure than in a car tire so do take care when the cork's being popped!

No other grape stands for German wine quite like this one. Treasured by wine drinkers on every continent, it even produced the most expensive wine in the world 100 years ago. Today, it still ranks among the white grape varieties of the highest quality even though it trails behind the wines from Bordeaux and Burgundy somewhat in price. I have tasted Rieslings throughout the world but nowhere does this grape feel more at home than in Germany.

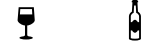
Grauburgunder (Pinot Gris)

Domaine Leflaive

This small winery in Burgundy enjoys a history that dates back to 1717. In the 20th century, the family-run estate worked its way to the wine world's top tier and the Chardonnays from Domaine Leflaive rank among France's most coveted wines. Following environmentally friendly working practices wherever possible has been important to the family for some time, hence the Leflaive's being credited as being pioneers of biodynamic viticulture in Burgundy.

The most famous of the Domaine Leflaive vineyards are to be found in the Côte de Beaune surrounding the Le Montrachet appellation. All neighbouring plots also have the name 'Montrachet' in their designation. One could almost say that this part of Burgundy represents the hub of the Chardonnay world as no other area produces such superb, high-quality wines from this grape variety as here.

Sauvignon Blanc

Sauvignon Blanc is 'joie de vivre' in a glass. This grape variety has an extremely intense bouquet of ripe fruits along with grass and spices. In New Zealand, even cat's pee is among the identified aromas in one or two examples. How delightful! Sauvignon Blanc can stimulate the taste buds in its own unique way and it combines extremely well with food.

Rosé

Rosé continues to be in vogue – no question about it. Simply considered for many years as a by-product of the red wine process, rosés have made great strides in terms of quality in the past couple of decades. Today, the wines are therefore more distinct and more demanding than before. They are no longer simply terrace wines but can now accompany food and are wines with depth and complexity.

Orange Wine

Orange wines are currently one of the most hotly discussed styles of wine in the world. They are white wines that are allowed to stay in contact with the grape skins. Sometimes, the colour of the wine changes to a more or less discreet orange due to this process. The aromas and taste always change. The aromas and tannins contained in the grape skins change the wine into something totally new. This technique has been practiced in some regions for hundreds of years but is currently being well received in the mainstream wine world, enriching it with an additional style.

Out of the boot

He is the god of light, bright sky and lightning. He escaped his father Saturn after birth and later overthrew him from the throne. Raised by a nymph, he hurls lightning bolts around with his thunderbolt that never missed their target. As the supreme of all gods, Jupiter decides wars, influences politics and punishes those who behave wrongly. The blood of the father of the gods, the Sanguis Jovis, is the namesake of the most famous Italian grape varieties Sangiovese. Wine has been throbbing through the veins of the Italian Republic for thousands of years. Two regions in particular have benefited from this relationship through millennia.

We start our journey in the northwest of the country. At the foot of the mountain, how Piedmont translates, you will find a sumptuous epicenter: white truffles, rich polenta and the best hazelnuts in the world, to name just a few specialties of the region. Matching the kitchen, Piedmont also grows very characterful drops. Here, at the foothills of the Alps, in the sleepy villages around Asti and Alba, it is the red wines that lead the qualitative spearhead of Italy.

The Barbera grape variety provides a high-quality entry into the world of Piedmontese wines. A prime example of this is the **2020 Pio Cesare Barbera d'Alba**, which reflects the richness and finesse of the region. However, the very terroir-sensitive variety Nebbiolo is the king of the region. In Barolo and Barbaresco, she produces wines that can be rustic and rich in tannins or soft and Burgundian. Their best specimens, such as the 2018 Prunotto Barolo, perform at the highest level worldwide. The grape variety probably owes its name to the autumnal morning fog (Nebbia), which stretches over the fairytale hilly landscape of the vineyards to harvest.



We operate on a qualitatively similar level in Tuscany. Here, at the foothills of the Italian Apennine mountains between Pisa, Florence and Siena, it has long been a cultural pioneer. In addition to Dante's literature and Michelangelo's art, the area is the origin of Italian Chianti. Over the last decades, two major wine philosophies have competed with each other: On the one hand, the traditionalists, who mainly insist on Sangiovese. On the other side are the modernists, who also work with grape varieties such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc.

The latter are responsible for the so-called Supertuscans, which have been playing at a world-class level since the 1980s. A producer that leads the status of Primus inter Pares is the winery Ornellaia. The flagship wine, the **2019 Ornellaia**, combines power, complexity and elegance. Something in the heart of Tuscany you will find the noble appellations Brunello di Montalcino and Vino Nobile di Montepulciano. These wines can be extremely complex and multi-layered. The **2018 Altesino Brunello di Montalcino** is a living wine made entirely from Sangiovese and serves as a model for many Tuscan wineries.

Whether the gods are responsible for wine culture or not is debatable. One thing can be said: The Italian wines are bursting with independence and quality and when enjoying an excellent Italian you can hear the angels or the nymphs singing.

California Dreamin‘

“All the leaves are brown, and the sky is grey...” sang the Mamas and the Papas in their 1965 folk rock classic. California has long been a dream destination for many. But when this song was first played, no one suspected that the Golden State would one day become one of the most important and exciting wine-growing regions in the world. California’s wine history is relatively short. Nevertheless, the region’s Pacific-influenced wines are among the best in the world. And they continue to improve as winemakers get to know their vineyards. In the course of this year’s California Wine Weeks, we want to focus on this region.

Domaine de la Romanée Conti

If the wine world had to agree on a winery that represents the pinnacle of quality, it might be the Domaine de la Romanée-Conti. Among connoisseurs, the winery is simply abbreviated as DRC, and these three letters carry a lot of weight. The Domaine is located in the sleepy village of Vosne-Romanée, close to some of Burgundy's best locations. DRC's eight Grand Cru vineyards are cultivated organically and with great attention to detail. On my last visit, I was even able to observe how the vineyards are worked with horses to protect the soil.

Pinot Noir

Pinot Noir or Spätburgunder is one of the world's most influential grape varieties. It is not only directly related to Weißburgunder and Grauburgunder, but is also a parent to a large number of grape varieties that have in the meantime become established. Great Pinot Noirs are hard to beat when it comes to intensity, complexity and longevity. Burgundy is viewed as the birthplace of Pinot Noir but nowadays Germany too produces some of this grape variety's best wines.

605, Martin Waßmer has specialized in Pinot Noir in the Markgräflerland. The SW is a special selection, for which yield reduction and aging in barriques are prescribed on the winery.

512, Weingut Dr. Heger is renowned for making great wines from the Burgundy grape varieties. This wine comes from one of the most famous Pinot Noir vineyard locations in Germany.

Germany is a red wine country. At least we produce more red wine here than you might think. Two thirds of the vineyards are planted with Dornfelder, Lemberger and Cabernet Sauvignon, among others. German Pinot Noir have now made it to a certain celebrity but the many other red grape varieties are not yet in all mouths. Here we make the beginning and present some exciting red drops, which we foresee a good future in Germany.
